He started with the bare minimum of equipment but with a 'fire in the belly' to build his own fence business. It was that fire and passion that has kept him going and building a company that has exceeded his original vision but has never reached his goal because.....he has continued to move the goal line further out each time he gets close.

In 2005, Dale purchased an empty lumber yard property in downtown Loveland that offered plenty of showroom, outside storage, fabrication shop space and more room to grow the one thing, he knows, fence!

Since moving in and opening at this new location in March of 2005, Dale has gone from a total of 25 sales people, office, installers and yard workers to over 70, with 15 outside sales people and 5 inside sales people, and 18 to 20 installation crews.

Eads Fence Company has grown into the largest commercial and residential fence company in Cincinnati and the surrounding tri-state market. The company has the largest fence selection and related products in the Mid-West, if not nationally. Many factory representatives have said in their travels around the nation they have never seen a fence operation as large or a showroom as large that exists at Eads Fence Company.

For years the company has been a full service operation, selling materials as well as installing all types of fence material, from cedar, treated wood, split rail, and chain link to aluminum, steel, and vinyl fencing.

To continue to grow the business, Dale added a custom iron fabrication department and then it was only natural to begin building custom gates and servicing gates and gate operator systems. The new "Gateworks" division now continues to grow as word spreads about the quality and technically proficient crews. Each gate service tech has gone to a nationally recognized training center to learn the finer details about







gate operators and their sophisticated computer systems.

When another growth opportunity came along in 2007, Dale opened a hometown hardware store in a section of the building that had been underutilized. Today "Loveland Hardware" has become a hometown business filling a void that this small community needed.

Dale has had a passion for nature and horticulture. He has achieved the rank of master gardener in his "spare" time. This hobby then led to a deer fence/prevention division, Tenax Mfg. He became a partner in the process supplying many deer fence products but also ground protection products and just this year we added Trakmat ground protection products to our line. These items have allowed us to serve the landscape industry and now the cemetery industry with a wide variety of products that allow large equipment to get into areas where the grass and soil need to be protected during digging or accessing work areas.

Eads has had a web site for the last 6 years but this year a new web site went operational for the online sale of deer fence products, repellants, and tools.





Rick Freitag served as senior project manager for restoration and rehabilitation of five National Cemetery boundary walls in four southern states. Projects included:

Barrancas National Cemetery, Pensacola FL, Mobile National Cemetery, Mobile AL, Natchez National Cemetery, Natchez MS, Beaufort National Cemetery, Beaufort SC St Augustine National Cemetery, St Augustine FL.

The \$4.6M project was administered by National Cemetery Administration.

Work scope included substantial quantities of 100% tuckpointing of brick walls, brick replacement, partial wall reconstruction, 100% brick wall reconstruction with new and salvaged brick, masonry cleaning, new concrete footings, new grade beam installations, iron fence restoration, stucco restoration, concrete repairs and replacement, masonry coatings, installation of drainage systems, grading and turf restoration.

In total, over 120,000 s.f. of brick masonry was 100% tuckpointed and 220,000 brick were re-laid in wall reconstruction efforts. The project took approximately 18 months to complete.

He championed for the independent owner, but had compassion for the "bigger" guy too. This was evident through his work on the many committees on which he served. Greg was past president of the Ohio Association of Cemeteries and served multiple terms on the board of directors, Greg was past president of the Cemetery Ethics Committee (now known as the Cemetery Dispute Resolution Committee), Greg was a member of the Ohio Association of Cemeteries and Superintendents and Officials, of which he had a helping hand in the merger of this group with the Ohio Association of Cemeteries, now known as the Ohio Cemetery Association, Greg was currently serving on the board of this new association. Greg was also a member of the International Cemetery Crematory and Funeral Home Association (ICCFA), where he served 2-3 year terms on its board of directors and Greg was also a past chairman of Toppers.

Greg was truly admired by his peers which was evident in some of the tributes that have been made to his family since his passing. Here are a few to help give you a better look into Greg Roberts the business man. "Greg brought me into the world of sales which has fashioned my life, Greg was a great mentor and motivator, he felt more like a brother to me than a boss", "Greg was such a great friend and mentor to me, he helped guide me along the way in my career, Greg had such a giving and loving heart", "Greg's faith in his Savior and his positive attitude has been an amazing and encouraging testimony to me as well as many, many others", "Greg was a cheerleader and I will never forget him", "The loss of Greg is a blow to all of us who knew him, Greg's positive outlook on life was contagious and I was quite in awe that it remained so even in the midst of his illness", "Greg's positive approach to work and life was an inspiration to all who knew him. His love and devotion to his family was a model for any man to follow", "Greg was a uniquely sincere man, he radiated warmth, kindness and thoughtfulness to everyone he encouraged. Greg lived a life of honor and total integrity." These sentiments go on and on to describe Greg, loving husband, father, brother, son and son-in-law.

Greg loved his family. His daughters were the light of his life, he bragged on them everywhere he went. He was an encourager to them. #### **Ashland County Memorial Park**

1058 U.S. 250 Ashland, OH 44805

Ashland County Memorial Park, located just north of Ashland on route 250, was first established in 1963. The cemetery was originally incorporated by E F Bell, Ethelyn Bell, and G P Gongwer. Jack Claxton of Athens owned the cemetery for several years, and J P Roberts along with his four sons bought the cemetery in 1980. Ashland is a small rural city, located in the center of Ashland County. The county population is 53,000. Like all Memorial Parks, the cemetery was developed by selling preneed cemetery lots. Ashland County Memorial Park, celebrating only its 50th year, has helped several thousand families prepare for their end of life needs by helping them secure their lots, burial vaults, and memorials before a death has taken place in the family. A small community mausoleum was added in 1989. During inclement weather, most families use the mausoleum chapel for their committal service. The park lawn theme, with all flush memorials and no upright monuments, is especially beautiful in Ashland as the cemetery is displayed from State Route 250.

In the spring of 2002 a funeral home was added to the property. In the first year of operation, over 200 people pre-arranged their funeral services with Roberts Funeral Home-Ashland Chapel. The families that use the funeral home are able to enjoy the convenience of having all arrangements made at one place, the cost savings of shared staff, the elimination of the funeral procession, and the option to have the committal service inside the funeral chapel if they desire.

It is with great anticipation that we look forward to hosting the OCA Fall Maintenance Seminar this year.

Our program started at 1:00 pm in our Veteran's Garden. Between 12:00 - 1:00pm we had several flyovers sponsored by the Historical Aircraft Squadron of Lancaster with a WWII L5 Stinson. We opened the program with the Lancaster Community Band playing the "Armed Forces Salute "while skydivers from Skydive Columbus trailed over the Veterans Garden carrying American Flags (see picture). Colors were posted while the Dexter family sang the Star Spangled Banner (see picture). A poem, "Freedom is not Free "was read before the playing of Taps. Our keynote speaker this year was State Senator Tim Schaffer (see picture). He gave a wonderful talk on Memorial Day and remembrance. Senator Schaffer's father is interred in our Veteran's Garden.

We introduced our new scattering garden, the Garden of Tranquility, located in a wooded area of our memorial park. Jeff Bazell, of Flowers of the Good Earth, instrumental in the design, spoke about the types of flowers. It is designed to have flowers bloom every season of the year (see picture). Once completed, the entrance will look like an English Garden, with a beautiful Arbor.

After staff introductions, we read the names of all who have been interred at Floral Hills since last Memorial Day. We observe a minute of silence in honor of those loved ones. The Dexter family sang Amazing Grace and on the third stance, we released over 100 doves (see picture). It is a beautiful closing for our Remembrance Program. We serve refreshments and were lucky enough again to have the Historical Aircraft Squadron bring a WWII Jeep and a Vietnam ambulance, open for anyone who wanted to sit in and/or have their picture taken. The large flags are donated from families of Veterans. They purchase the flag pole and a bronze name plate and we fly the flags in their honor on

Memorial Day, Veterans Day, Flag Day, Independence Day and September 11th.

We honor those who have served to protect and preserve our God given right of freedom. Parade starts from Dow and Seventh St. at 10:00 AM, proceeds north on Seventh to Main, West on Main to Hyatt, South on Hyatt with a brief stop at the Veterans Memorial to lay the Memorial Wreath and offer a prayer, then on to the Cemetery. For the elderly and disabled Veterans who would like to ride from Dow in the parade be at the front of the formation by 9:45 AM.

#### **VETERANS MEMORIAL**

The City of Dover Cemeteries has had a long history of providing its local veterans a final resting place. The first veterans section was established in 1886 at the Maple Grove Cemetery. This section has 42 burial spaces with the last interment taking place in 1968. The Dover Cemeteries then established the second veterans section at the Dover Burial Park in the early 1930's. This section is comprised of 104 burial spaces with the final service taking place in 2012.



The planning stages for the new veterans section began in the Fall of 2011. With cremation trends continuing to increase from year to year, we wanted to layout the new section

to accommodate not only full burials but also cremation urns. The new section has 28 cremation lots and 126 full burial lots. Each Veteran interment will be marked with a 2'x1' bronze military marker. The section has a 5' colored and hand etched cement walkway that is centered in the middle of the section. The walkway leads up to our Veterans feature that was designed and manufactured by the Cold Spring Granite Company. The feature has one upright that stands 8' tall and two wings which spans across 14' in total. The upright has a hand painted American flag which is enclosed by wording that states, "IN MEMORY OF ALL WHO SERVED GOD AND COUNTRY". The two wings have six 12" bronze emblems representing each branch of service and P.O.W.'s.

The City of Dover held the dedication service for the new section and memorial on Memorial Day 2013. We had around 300 residents attend the ceremony along with our high school band which played patriotic songs. The City of Dover is very proud of this new section and feature which should provide veterans spaces for the next 75-100 years.






