

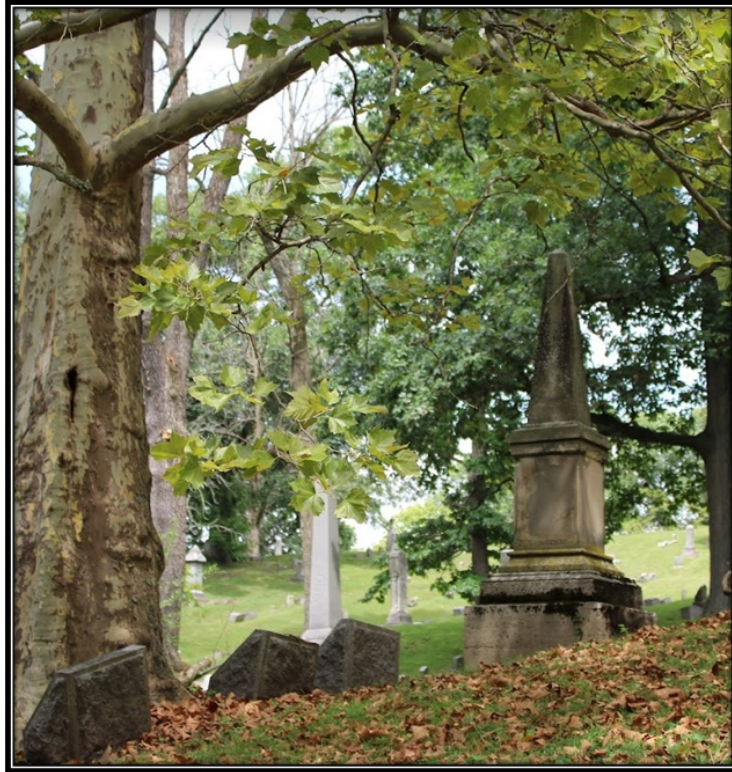

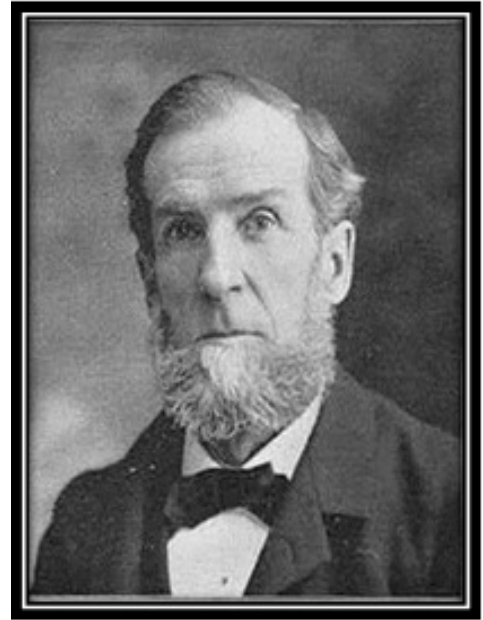
Dayton's Walk of Fame & Woodland Updates

Thank You Dayton Garden Club!



On June 29, 1922, Katharine Houk Talbott gathered a group of friends to form a garden club. The purpose of the Garden Club of Dayton was to share their knowledge and love of gardening, protect native plants and birds, and to encourage civic planting. Written into the club's constitution was the requirement that members must be gardeners, not 'theorists'—people who keep gardens and work in those gardens themselves. The efforts of its members were focused on the promotion of a general appreciation of civic beauty and betterment.

Mrs. Talbott was a prominent citizen and "tour de force," involved in many areas of the cultural and civic life of Dayton. She and Ethel Rike were the first two presidents of the Garden Club of Dayton—both women rest peacefully at Woodland.

Today's Dayton Garden Club has graciously adopted the garden surrounding the Wright family plot at Woodland. They have been busy tidying up the perennials in preparation for spring, when they plan to revamp and possibly expand the garden.

McMillan Angel: Repairs Underway!

Piece by Piece:

Manager of Preservation Misti Spillman, assisted by Dwayne Lesile & John Hornbrook of Woodland's multi-talented grounds crew, have been carefully repairing the McMillen Angel's broken arm and wing.

The iconic monument was damaged earlier this year when a storm knocked a large tree branch onto the marble sculpture.

Using expert techniques and an artistic eye, the Angel's broken hand was repaired with epoxy and mortar, then carefully set back into place. This week, the largest pieces of wing were reattached.



Unless weather cooperates, further repairs will have to wait until spring, but Misti is confident that the Angel will be back at her best within the year.

Woodland is seeking volunteers to give presentations to community groups on subjects such as local history, notable biographies, and trees.

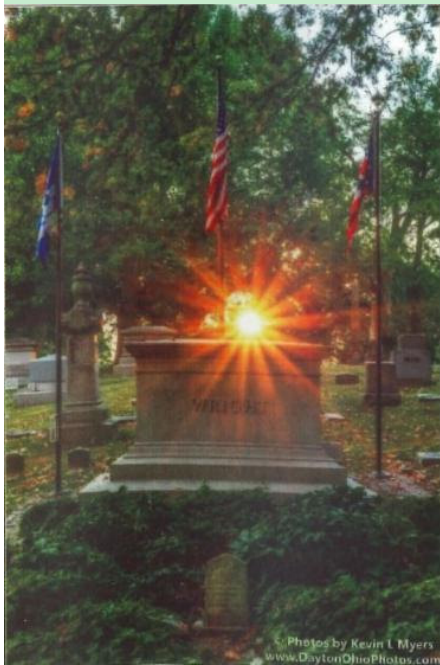

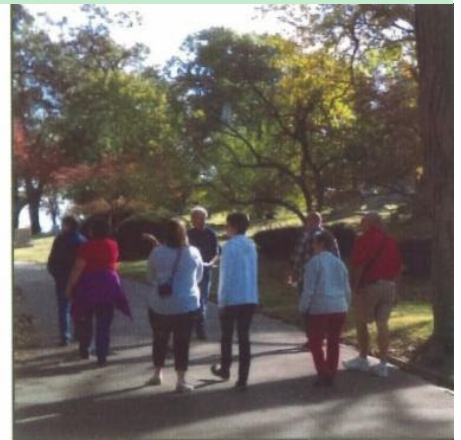
