

Did You Know?


Leaf color is influenced by three pigments: chlorophyll, carotenoids, and anthocyanin.





During the growing season, leaves continually produce chlorophyll—which makes leaves appear green. As the autumn evenings grow longer, chlorophyll production slows down.

When the chlorophyll is destroyed, the carotenoids and anthocyanin that are already present in the leaf are revealed. Carotenoids produce yellow and orange shades, while anthocyanin is associated with reddish colors.

PVT. Enoch Haskins Jr.

(7/23/1765 - 8/29/1838)

Enoch Haskins Jr. (sometimes 'Haskin') was born July 23rd, 1765, in Norwich, Connecticut. His parents were Enoch & Mary (Williams) Haskins.

In 1776, while living in Massachusetts, Enoch enlisted in the militia. His company was commanded by Capt. William Francis, and ordered to march to Albany, New York, by Gen. Schuyler. In 1778, PVT Enoch Haskins Jr. entered the 'transportation service', where he served as an 'emergency man'—someone whose job it is to be sure people and materiel get to the places they need to be.

At the age of 22, in 1787, Enoch married Lydia Ackley. Together, they had (as far as we know) two sons and four daughters.

Due to surviving pension records, we know that Enoch Haskins Jr. was severely wounded during the last battle at the Siege of Yorktown in 1781. He was placed on the pension roll in 1819, and received an annual allowance of \$26.66.

Enoch Haskins Jr. died April 29th, 1838 at the age of 72. He is buried in section 51, lot 161 at Woodland Cemetery.
