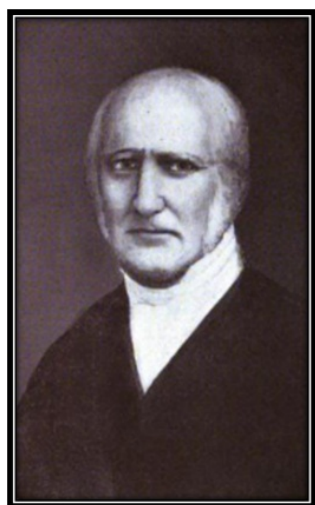

War of 1812: 1812-1815



Sgt. Maj. Joseph Halsey Crane

(8/31/1782 - 11/13/1851)

Transcribed from the Urbana Citizen & Gazette, published 11/21/1851 on page 2:

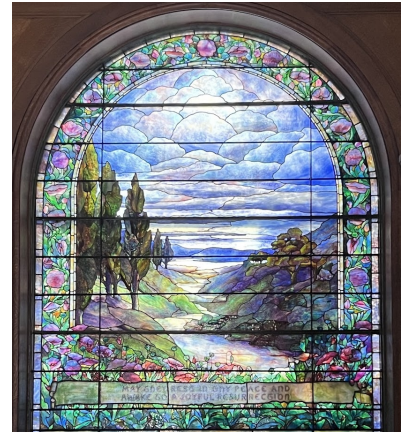
“Death of Judge Crane—Joseph H. Crane, another of the men who saw Dayton in its early beginnings, and made it their home long ago, has passed from among us. He expired at 7 o’clock on Wednesday evening, having fully accomplished his three score years and ten, with usefulness and honor. On the Bench, in the Halls of Legislation, as a member of the Bar, he was distinguished for the honesty, ability, and dignity which adorn public station; as a man, in every relation of private life he was kind and generous; as a Christian, meek and charitable. —His end was as peaceful and happy as his life has been honorable and good. —Dayton Gazette of the 14th.”

If you need help finding where someone is buried, need directions to a particular area, or have questions about pre-planning or funeral services, Woodland's Staff is here to assist you!

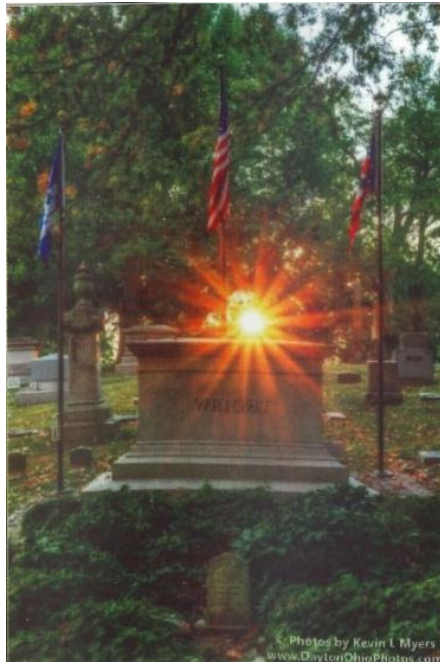
