# **Legislative Update**

There has been substantial legislative activity regarding cemetery law matters over the last quarter. Here's a summary of the principal legislative initiatives directly impacting the cemetery industry such time period:

#### Cemetery Grant Program Bill

House Bill 168, which has been commonly referred to as the Cemetery Grant Program Bill and which was passed the House of Representatives on September 21, 2017, was before the Senate Finance Committee first quarter of 2018. The Bill did not illicit any opposition while it was before such Committee and ultimately was positively referred to the Senate by the Committee on February 28, 2018. While the Senate has not exactly rushed to vote on the Bill, Representative Stein, the Bill's Sponsor, expects passage by the Senate in the near future. Once passed by the Senate, the Bill will not be referred back to the House as it was not amended while before the Senate Finance Committee. As such, passage by the Senate will enact the legislative, probably with a ninety (90) day delayed effective date.

As you might recall, HB 168 will, among other matters, create the Ohio Cemetery Grant Program to provide grants "to all registered cemeteries, except for for-profit cemeteries, to defray the costs of the maintenance of the cemetery or training of cemetery personnel in the maintenance and operation of cemeteries". The specifics of the grant applications and award criteria would be developed over time through the rule making process.

Additionally, HB 168 contains several cemetery law "clean-ups", including: (i) that insurance policies are permissible alternatives to bonding of individual trustees of statutorily required cemetery trusts; and (ii) that such trusts may adopt the Ohio Uniform Prudent Investor Act as their investment standards.

#### "Total Return" Legislative Effort

The Ad Hoc "Total Return Committee", comprised of the Legislative Committee and other OCA Members, counsel and several financial industry experts, continues to work in the background to study legislative alternatives to the limitation of spending only "dividends and interest" from a cemetery's statutorily required Endowment Care Trust. The "total return" alternative would allow the annual withdrawal of a stated percentage of the Trust's principal balance. The theory behind such a shift is that removing the Trust's inherent bias toward investments that produce dividends and interest, and expand the use of growth stocks, will allow the fund to grow more over time and better serve the cemetery's need for perpetual maintenance.

As some may recall, consideration was given to attempting to add a "Total Return" amendment to HB 168. However, for a variety of reasons, such strategy was not ultimately employed. As such, the Total Return Committee continues to discuss the terms of preferred Bill while attention is paid to finding an avenue to introduce a separate Bill or to attempt to add a "Total Return" amendment to another Bill.









#### Goal Setting by Tom Hopkins


Begin by setting 20-year goals. List the personal achievements you want to accomplish. Who and what do you want to be in 20 years? What do you want to own? Where and in what kind of

# **Successful Cemetery Spring Seedings**

Spring seedings can be very successful, or very unsuccessful! It all depends on when you plant your seed, your seeding rate (which is different for every grass seed



blend and mixture), the amount of broadleaf weeds and annual grasses such as crabgrass that compete with the young seedlings, and ultimately, how Mother Nature treats you with temperatures and timely rainfall.

**TIMING:** As a general rule of thumb, the earlier the better for getting your seed planted. As the Spring unfolds, temperatures get hotter and the moisture available to the plant evaporates quicker. An April seeding will provide far superior results than seed planted in May, June or after.

High quality grass seed, free of broadleaf weeds and grasses that cannot be easily controlled by selective herbicides, are in very short supply in 2018! Take the time to read the seed tags and select the right grass varieties for your area, as there is a lot of very poor quality grass seed in the market today.

#### **PROPER SEEDING**

RATE Every seed blend and mixture has a different seeding rate due to the size of the seed and the number of seeds contained in a pound of seed. The time you take to calibrate your seeder before starting your seeding project will be time well spent!

**SEED TO SOIL CONTACT IS A MUST!:** Simply throwing grass seed out on your cemetery plots and crossing your fingers that it will germinate isn't the most strategic plan. Ensure the seed is in direct contact with the soil by scratching up the area you're seeding prior to planting.

**FEED THE BABY:** Use a good seed starter fertilizer containing high amounts of Phosphorus such as Green Velvet's 14-21-5, 18-24-12 with 25% PCSCU or a great starter fertilizer for use in hydroseeding is our 19-19-19 seed starter. For best results, take a soil test of different areas in your cemetery and adjust your fertilizer program accordingly.

PROTECT YOUR SEEDINGS: We recommend an easy-to-spread product called HydroStraw All Purpose Straw to spread atop your new seedings. Unlike your typical bale of straw, this sterilized straw product is weed free, easy to carry and does not require a hydroseeder to apply. The green tint of HydroStraw makes hand spreading over gravesites a quick and easy task; and looks professional to your customer as they wait for the seed to germinate on their loved one's gravesite. One 50 lb bag will cover approximately 5-6 graves.

**CONTROL THE WEEDS:** Because every other broadleaf weed and annual grass is germinating and competing with your new grass plants for sunlight, food and water, it's critical that you have a good weed control program for your spring seedings! For liquid applications, Tenacity Herbicide (Mesotrione) should be at the top of your list because of its control of both broadleaf weeds and annual grasses and ability to be applied on newly seeded areas, without harming the grass seed as it germinates. If you prefer to go the granular route, our best starter fertilizer/weed control product is our new 21-22-4 seed starter with Mesotrione! When applied at time of seeding, Mesotrione won't hurt your seed but will provide control of weeds and grasses! Of course, our 12-24-12 Seed starter with Siduron applied at time of seeding has been a popular option for decades, as well!

# Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum Awarded Level II Accreditation by ArbNet Accreditation Program

DAYTON, OH – Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum in Dayton has been awarded a Level II Accreditation by The ArbNet Arboretum Accreditation Program and The Morton Arboretum, for achieving particular standards of professional practices deemed important for arboreta and botanic gardens. The ArbNet Arboretum Accreditation Program is the only global initiative to officially recognize arboreta at various.

the only global initiative to officially recognize arboreta at various levels of development, capacity, and professionalism. Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum is also now recognized as an accredited arboretum in the Morton Register of Arboreta, a database of the world's arboreta and gardens dedicated to woody plants.

Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum sits in the heart of downtown Dayton on over 200 verdant acres of rolling hills with over 3000 trees on the property. Founded in 1841 and established by John Van Cleve, Van Cleve chose the original 40 acre site for its hilltop views and remarkable variety of trees. In 1843, Van Cleve did an inventory of the trees on the property and found 41 different species. In the early years, special care was taken to preserve the finest specimens of trees and shrubs to retain the natural beauty of the area. Most of these tree species are still represented on the grounds and the species list has grown to over 165. Woodland is best known for its collection of Oak trees. Of the 58 species that are native to North America, Woodland has 25 varieties. Over the years, Woodland has been the recipient 10 "State Champion Tree" awards from the Ohio Division of Forestry.

Woodland continues to grow its tree population with strategic removal of dying or distressed trees. Removal of such trees allows the undergrowth the opportunity to flourish and to fill in the canopy where needed. The arboretum works closely with Mark Webber, a Board Certified Master Arborist, to select and plant trees and shrubs throughout the grounds. Additionally, Woodland was selected by the Ohio Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture (OCISA) to hold a series of free educational programs for green industry professionals at the arboretum through April 2019. Beginning in May 2018, Woodland will offer its annual series of tree tours called Let's Talk Trees which will be held on the second Wednesday of each month, May through October, at 10:00 a.m.

Webber stated that, "If you like trees and plants that have stood the test of time, then a visit to Woodland should be on your calendar. When I first visited Woodland in 1986, I was taken aback by how grand the trees of this place were, by how their branches created a cathedral-like experience. More so, the collections of trees and plants at Woodland are a beautiful living botanical guide for anyone who wants to experience and or learn about plants. However more compelling is how the trees of Woodland play such a significant role in Dayton's urban core by improving air quality, reducing ozone, having a place of solitude and remembrance, and providing other critical social and environmental services. Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum is one of Dayton, Ohio's most magnificent jewels of the Gem City."
